REIMAGINE LANSING'S RIVERS AND RIVER TRAILS

Reimagine, Revisit, and Experience the Transformational Change.

It was not long ago that Lansing's rivers were choked with trees and logs making them difficult, dangerous, and often impossible to navigate. Caught behind these river-wide obstructions were large pools of litter and trash, and there were long stretches of river that had long been neglected. It was an unsightly mess.

That is all in the past now.

Since October of last year we have fielded over 30 projects to remove litter, trash, and other evidence of urban living from Lansing area rivers and river trail. From the onset, we received enthusiastic support from local businesses, clubs, schools, churches, media, and passionate individuals. We are also pleased with the growing support of government; specifically that of Lansing's Parks and Recreation Department.

Our first stewardship outreach was with the new owners of Adrian and Blissfield Railroad Company. After a call in the morning, we met that afternoon and agreed to work together to clear a longstanding river-wide obstruction below their railroad bridge in north Lansing. With that meeting a plan was put in place and volunteers recruited. This marked the official beginning of Michigan Waterways Stewards.



With growing acceptance of our work the City of Lansing asked us to lead two city-wide rivers and river trail cleanups. We accepted without hesitation. The first event took place in June with the second scheduled for September.

We have been thrilled by the interest and offers of support. Participation rates for our June event far exceeded our expectations and it clearly demonstrates Lansing community pride. With 270 volunteers we were able to cover all our designated river and river trail areas, with many being covered twice or more.

A large collection of tires, grocery carts, barbecue grills, highway cones and markers, abandoned bicycles and e-scooters, fencing, signage, scrap metal, pallets, steel doors, softballs, baseballs, golfballs, and scrap metal was retrieved. There was also the expected collection of glass, plastics, paper, styrofoam and articles of clothing. The largest item that eluded us was the thick steel cable that once secured the floating fountain in the area of Lansing's convention center. Despite our best effort, with it still secured to the bottom of the river, we were unable to retrieve it.

Additionally, river-wide obstructions were cleared and passages opened in other areas making it easy, safe, and pleasant to navigate Lansing's rivers without having to make a difficult portage around those nonpermanent structures.

With the help of hundreds of volunteers, and many of Lansing's top businesses, clubs, and other exceptional organizations, we didn't just clean and clear our treasured rivers and prized river trail, we unveiled an incredible urban experience. We created an urban experience that most cities across Michigan and our Upper Midwest would covet.

As we turn our focus toward achieving sustainability, we have begun discussions to make our second Lansing Rivers and River Trail Cleanup bigger, better, and truly a community-wide celebration. Mark you calendars for Friday, September 22.


