As my skill and confidence grew so did my desire to accomplish more; whether it be to paddle faster, travel longer, or seek greater challenges.


Then I had the thought about setting world records.




I have paddled 6,335 miles over my first seven seasons.





RECOMMENDED ACTION AND BENEFITS SUMMARY

A 1.25 mile stretch in Meridian Township, with its eight river-wide obstructions, makes Red Cedar River passage difficult for all and impassible for many. As waters rise and the river quickens, additional areas may prove impassable and certainly more dangerous. Several of these entanglements are so jammed up with trees, logs, and other natural debris, they may contribute to flooding during spring thaw and periods of heavy rain.

The removal of these eight river-wide obstructions will:

- Contribute to making the Red Cedar River a treasured community asset.
 - Improves the user experience.
 - Improves user safety.
- Build on Meridian Township's prized park system.
- Mitigate the risk of potential flooding.
- Help promote the Red Cedar River as a top Mid-Michigan destination for fishing, paddling, and floating.
- Help create a vibrant river-long community.
- Be worthy of a grand celebration: Red Cedar River Run.

With the Red Cedar River at seasonal low levels at the time, and with accessible river trails on river left (south side), removal of these river-wide entanglements would have been easiest and safest then.

Introducing Michigan Waterways Rescue Unit

Michigan Waterways Rescue Unit (MWRU)

- A first of its kind concept
- Provides all that is needed
- Any group, small or large, can now conduct waterways stewardship

MWRU will consist of an enclosed cargo trailer containing an inflatable catamaran, electric engine, canoes, Jon boat, PFDs, paddles, 4x4 ATV, trash picker grabbers, trash grabbing nets, thick ml trash bags, contractor bags, buckets, ropes, chain and cable, grappling hook, industrial magnets, first aid kids, an equipment cleansing station, and more.

MWRU is a game changer, it allows for:

- Scalability
- Sustainability
